Our partner society CVOVS is located in a rural area in the West of the country near Fort Portal, about 185 miles (~ 300 km) or a five hour drive from the capital Kampala.

Uganda is an East African landlocked country with about 45 million inhabitants. It is surrounded by Kenya, Tanzania, Rwanda, Congo, and South Sudan. 80% of the population are farmers whose harvest is often so poor that it is just enough for one's personal use.

## CHILDREN'S VALUES

Our society „Werte der Kinder e. V.“ (Children's Values) expresses with it's name that all children are esteemed equally. Poor or rich, impaired or high flyer, small or tall, from the country or city child – we see faces.



The Ugandan KETI KAJUMBA worked as a teacher for many years and knows about the school problems of her home country. A couple of years ago she founded a society for supporting deprived children there.

As a post-graduate of special education at the Carl von Ossietzky university she initiated „Werte der Kinder e. V.“ which became a registered society in Oldenburg in October 2023.

Free primary and secondary schooling is a huge challenge for an (East) African Country as Uganda. Because of that schools just get the salary of the teachers and instructional materials. Parents are asked to help building the schools.

For a couple of years now, children attending public schools in Uganda don't have to pay school fees any more. Nevertheless, there are still a lot of costs: exercise books, pens, notebooks, lunch or the mandatory school uniform still have to be paid.

Many of the poorer families cannot generate a surplus to pay for the educational extra costs. As a result, many children, especially girls, cannot go to school.
